# Scholarships totaling \$111,900 go to 71 Class of '95 Seniors'

More than 400 people attended the 114th annual reunion and banquet of the Salem High School Alumni Association June 3 at the school. The Association rewarded 71 graduating seniors with \$111,900 in scholarships.

That total pushed the scholarships awarded to \$1.7 million since 1908, honoring 1,018 students. Treasurer Charles Gibbs announced that gifts totaling \$113,000 had been received in the last year including major amounts from the estate of Dorothy Failer Sullivan ('21), Robert Sebo ('64) and the late Dr. Floyd Stone and Cora May Reich Stone ('35).

#### Thanked for 'Caring'

The Association now has assets of \$2,656,000, Gibbs said. It awards regular academic scholarships, vocational scholarships, Charles Fox medical scholarships, Max Fisher athletic awards plus funds from the Young family fund.

Gibbs thanked all the graduates "for caring and remembering."

Newly elected Association President Connie Christofaris Cranmer announced that new members of the Executive Committee are Mary Lou Minichelli Hartzell ('59), Ed Emch ('71) and Kenneth Kenst ('68). Fred E. Cope ('25) and Joyce Cosgrove Ehrhart ('53) were re-elected to the Scholarship Committee.

Shawn Catlos, president of the graduating 1995 class, responded for his classmates, thanking the association for its support and for its scholarships. The class contributed \$200.

# Rising Tuition costs means more funding

Dr. Gail Herron, Scholarship Committee chairman, presented the academic awards, congratulating the

honorees for their energy and industry. He pointed out that funds are still needed to keep pace with accelerating college tuition costs. He also praised Gibbs for his management of the association funds, a job he has been performing for many years.

#### **Custom continues**

Cora May Stone distributed the vocational awards to eight students, given to those who are not going to attend four-year colleges. She and her 1935 class started the custom of vocational awards in 1987.

Nine athletes received Max Fisher scholarships, awarded by Tom Jesko, who wished the winners continued success.

The 50-year class of 1945 was introduced by outgoing President Joe Ciotti. Charles Schaeffer gave the class response, calling his group a "typical great class" of 159 students. He gave a humorous reading, recalling all the new inventions that had not even existed in 1945. He presented a class gift of \$3,000 to the association.

The 60-year Class of 1935 and the 55-year Class of 1940 were also introduced.

#### Lowry honored

Ciotti also presented the 1995 honored alumnus, Raymond J. Lowry, Salem businessman.

Lowry introduced his family and several key employees who helped his career and aided in building the Lowry Supply Co. "I am most grateful for our success and for those who helped."

He urged public support for school financing, saying: "You have enjoyed all the privileges of gaining an education so please don't be just a taker—give something back."

He received from Ciotti a large silver tray honoring his selection.

# SHS alumni rate standing "0"

The Salem High School Alumni Association was saluted in June by the Salem News in the following editorial.

DON'T SAY THIS TOWN UNCAR-ING

"In the wake of the failure of the income tax levy that would have benefitted Salem schools, we received many letters—particularly from students—who accused the voting public of being uncaring.

"In the letters, much emphasis was put on the loss of funded sports programs and the potential pay-to-play scenario.

"We heard little, though, about the funding effects on academics, most likely because school officials will put academics first as they prioritize what can be maintained.

"It is therefore a joy to be able to report—as we did in Monday's Salem

News—that a caring, giving group of current and former residents continues to make contributions to a thriving scholarship foundation.

"For the end of this school year alone, 71 graduating seniors received a total of \$111,900 in scholarships from the Salem High School Alumni Association. The Association has awarded more than \$1.7 million in scholarship money since 1908.

"School levies and issues continue to sometimes fail and sometimes pass in communities across Ohio. We are no different.

"But this community, through the persistent efforts of its alumni association and the generosity of former students and other individuals, has consistently continued to provide financial aid to graduating seniors."

# Aouston airport names Vacar chief officer

Richard Vacar, a 1964 Salem High graduate, has been named deputy director of operations and maintenance for the Houston (Texas) Airport System.

As chief operating officer for the Houston Department of Aviation, Vacar will have oversight management responsibility for Houston International.

Vacar is a former FAA air traffic controller, a licensed pilot and an attorney. Until recently, Vacar was executive director of Sarasota-Bradenton International Airport in Florida, responsible for management for the past six years and oversaw construction of a \$56 million terminal.

Prior to that, he was deputy director of operations for California's Burbank-lendale-Pasadena Airport Authority. He also worked as a corporate and commuter airline pilot, following four years in the U.S. Air Force.





# O.S.B.A. head ending term

Patricia Schmidt McNicol ('53), 1995 president of the Ohio School Boards Association, believes that being involved in the education of children is the most important endeavor one can undertake.

As she nears the end of her term, the Salem High graduate leads 735 school boards across the state in promoting the advancement of public education in Ohio.

A registered nurse by profession, McNicol became involved in education when she volunteered in 1981 to serve on a citizens committee to write a district discipline code.

In 1982 she began her board career and is now completing her 12th year, having served as board president and delegate to the State Capitol Conference.

In 1987 she was nominated to the OSBA northeast regional board, the lowest rung on the ladder, and has ascended through the ranks to the final rung, being installed as the 40th president of OSBA in a ceremony held in her home school district.

Her goals as president have been to stimulate interest in OSBA through widespread involvement of its members. "We are the voice of the students," she says. Top priorities of OSBA involved lobbying for adequate

and equitable funding for education and retaining local control for each individual school district.

McNicol was to be among the 1% of the most effective American educators invited to attend a week-long leadership seminar at Lawrence University in Appleton, Wisc.; served as a member of the Federal Relations Network who lobby on education issues in Washington, D.C., and this year was Ohio's delegate to the National School Boards Association Delegate Assembly in San Francisco, Calif.

McNicol is the daughter of the late William and Ruth Schmidt. She was educated in St. Paul Catholic School and was graduated along with her twin brother, Jim, from Salem High School in 1953. She was commencement speaker and a member of the winning state debate team. She was graduated from St. Elizabeth Hospital School of Nursing in Youngstown, Ohio, and attended Youngstown University. She served as Director of Nursing Service at the then Salem City Hospital and taught at both St. Elizabeth's School of Nursing and Hannah E. Mullins School of Practical Nursing.

Active in community affairs, she is past president of the Salem High School Alumni Association; past president of the Board of Managers of Century Home; past president of the Salem Garden Club and a life member of Garden Club of Ohio. She has served as president of the Northeast Region of OSBA and trustee for OSBA. She currently serves on the nominating committee for the Central Region of the National School Boards Association. She is a member of the Catholic Daughters of the Americas and a member of the selection committee for Habitat for Humanity. She is also a registered American Red Cross nurse and a member of the Alumni Association of St. Elizabeth Hospital School of Nursing. In 1994 she was awarded the YWCA Women of Achievement in Education Award.


#### And in 1995...
