It will be a reunion to top all reunions *Coaches, band directors to be honored*

The Salem High School Class Reunion for the Millennium, Reunion 2000, is scheduled for Saturday, July 1, 2000 at the Saxon Country Club on state Route 9, south of Salem from 5:30 p.m. to midnight. Tom Vacar ('67), a Fox television/consumer reporter in San Francisco, will be the master of ceremonies for the events.

The New Breed, one of the most popular groups from the region during the late 1960's and early 1970's, will perform with music from different eras. Gary Kekel ('60) is in charge of entertainment and promises live performances from some Salem High graduates throughout the evening.

The purpose of the event is to raise money for the Salem High School Athletic Boosters and Band Boosters. Proceeds from the events scheduled throughout the weekend will be split equally between the two organizations.

The reunion will also honor past Salem High head coaches, athletic directors and band directors from the 1900's to the present. The efforts of these special people have, in one form or another, made the high school special. A large plaque will list all of them which organizers hope will be mounted in the high school for the new millennium.

On Friday evening, June 30 at 6:30 p.m. at Timberlanes, all past coaches and directors will be asked and invited to attend the dinner in their honor. The dinner/reception will be used to raise added funds. The millenium plaque will be presented to the Board of Education. The Friday evening event will enable people to support the reunion who may be unable to attend the event on Saturday evening.

A pancake breakfast is planned for

Saturday morning, July 1 at the Salem High School cafeteria from 8 to 11 a.m.

All graduates will be assembled on the bleachers in the high school at 9:30 a.m. for a group photo. Copies can be purchased, and the photo will be mounted with the millenium plaque. Committee planners say the breakfast will provide a photo opportunity for all Salem High graduates who attend.

Jerry Wolford of Salem Video Arts will film all of the activities on Friday and Saturday and copies will be available for purchase.

Tours will be available at specific hours to visit the alumni office, and the junior high and senior high school buildings. The committee hopes out-of-towners will visit the church of their choice.

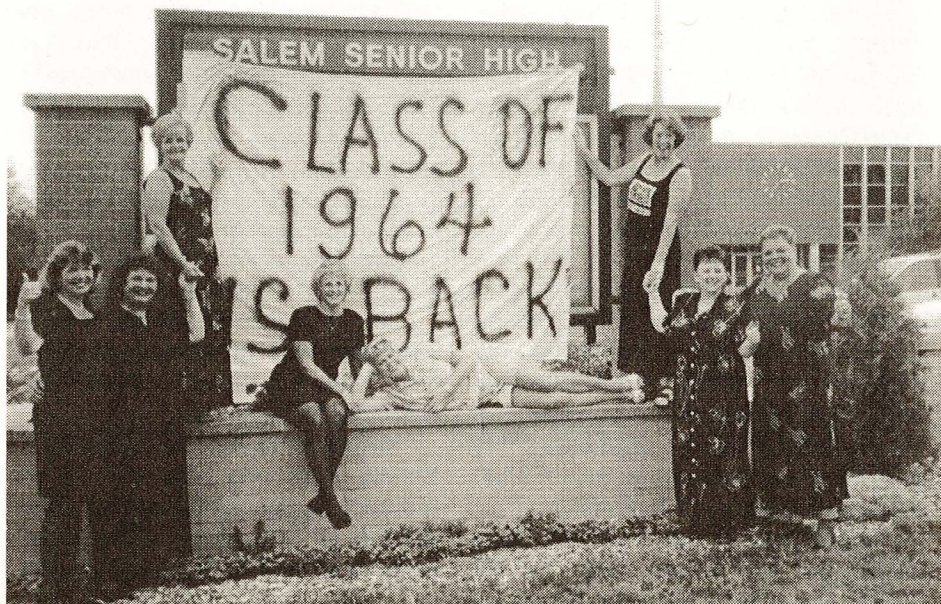
A big thank you

Smith executive director of child learning center

The new executive director of the Long Run Children's Learning Center in White Oak, Pa. is a Salem High 1968 graduate who has been involved in early childhood education for 25 years, including teaching in the classroom, administrative work and publications.

Tom Smith, who resides in Pittsburgh assumed the post in the new \$1.5 million building, taking over from Bertha Mae Chaplin who has been with the center for 35 years.

"At this time in my life, this was a position that I felt was rewarding and challenging for me," Tom says. He has been looking for a position where he

could work with children directly, and he feels the Long Run center, originally named the McKeesport Pre-School for Exceptional Children, is the one.

After graduating from Carnegie Mellon University with a degree in psychology in 1972, Tom served as director of the Oakland Children's Center from 1974 to 1978. From there, he worked as child development coordinator for Louise Child Care, based in McKeesport and other Mon Valley communities from 1979 to 1988. From 1986 to 1988, he was a clinical field instructor for the University of Pittsburgh.

In 1980, he received a certificate in the Play Therapy Training Program from the Pittsburgh Psychoanalytic Center. From 1989 to 1990, Tom did course work in personnel management at St. Francis College.

Over the past 10 years, he has worked at the University of Pittsburgh in Generations Together, an intergenerational studies program consisting of consulting, training and working indirectly with teachers, parents and their children.

He received his master's degree in library science from the University of Pittsburgh.

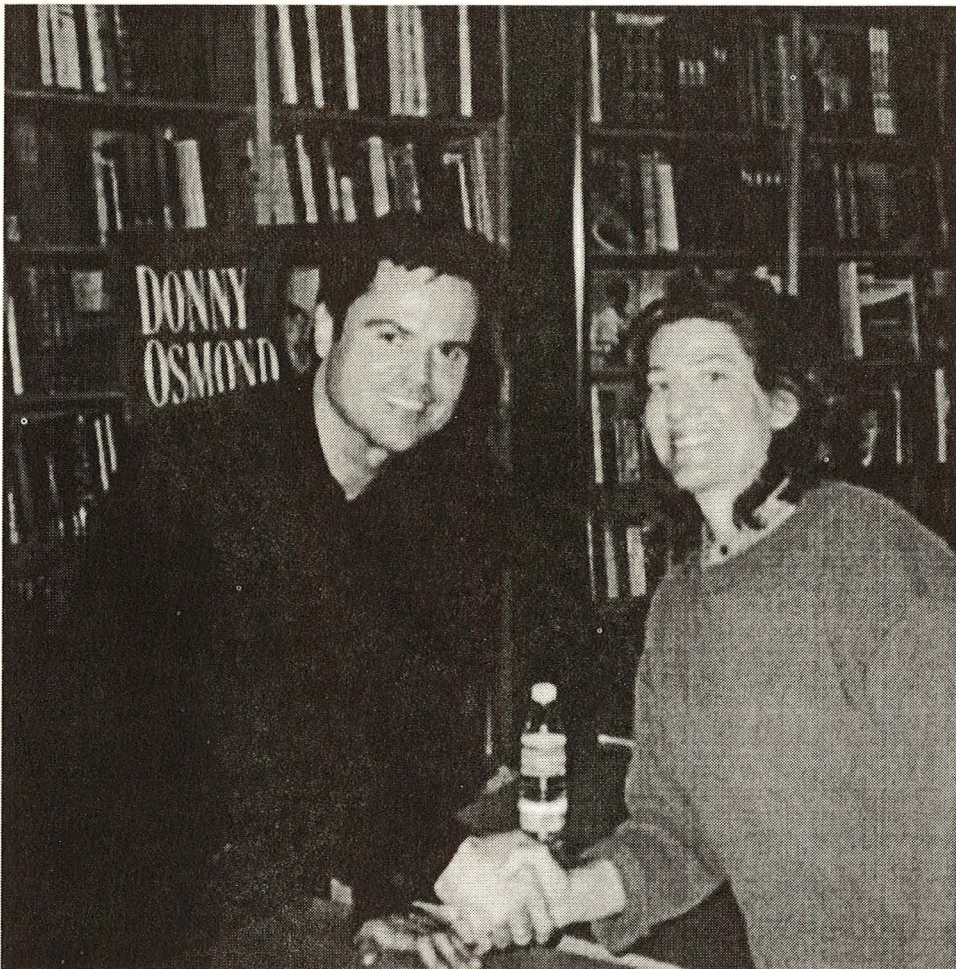

Videos of Salem are available

A series of video tapes about Salem have been produced by Jerry Wolford ('57) and Richard Theiss ('48).

"Salem - The Complete Community" is a look at Salem's past and present, showing the 1994-95 renovation of downtown and present day Salem. About 20 minutes in length, the tape is \$21 plus \$2.50 per set shipping and handling.

"Salem, Ohio in the Early Fifties" is a two-volume set of the original 1951 film show in Salem, showing hundreds of school children, scouts, clubs and businesses in the 1950's. Over 2-1/2 hours long, the cost is \$52.70 plus \$5 per set shipping.

Three readers have solved the mystery of the protruding pipe shown in the 1938 photograph of the old high school building published in the spring issue. The answer: the pipe was the cap for the artesian well there. We thank Sam Pridon, Fred Krauss ('43) and longtime Salem News editor and community leader Ray L. Dean for the answer.

Fred says the city maintained the well, and workers came up to do maintenance work from time to time.

Ray says "there was an artesian well (maybe two) at the site and they were capped over because the city no longer needed them."

"Incidentally, although I am an alumnus of Canton McKinley, I practically grew up with many SHS students, helped promote SHS throughout the ensuing years, and consider myself one of you all." He signed his note, Ray Dean, a fixture in Salem since '34.

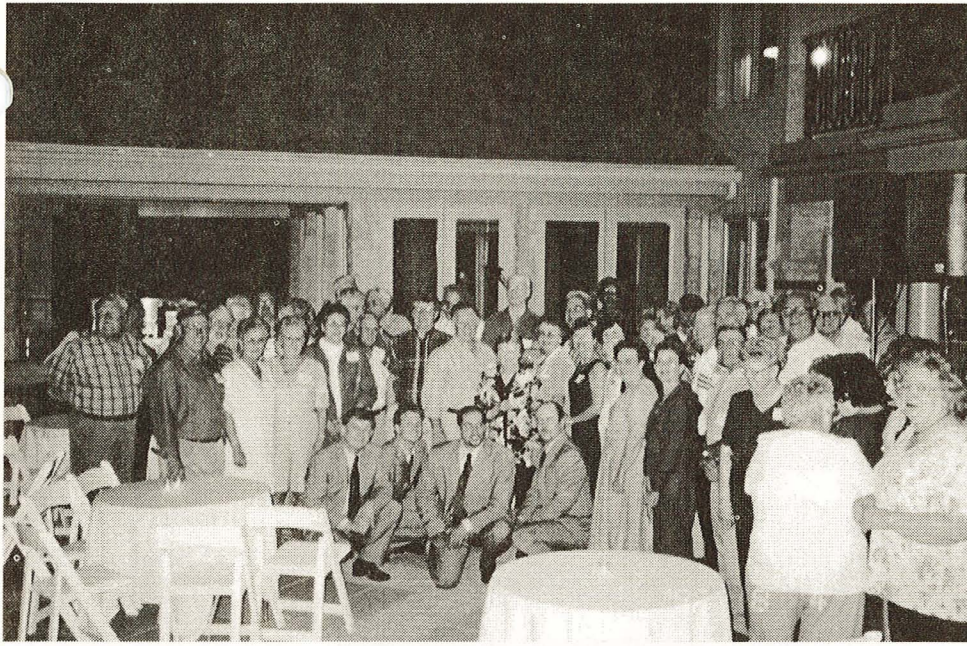

The Salem Community Calender, printed annually for the benefit of designated non-profit organizations in Salem, is available by mail order.

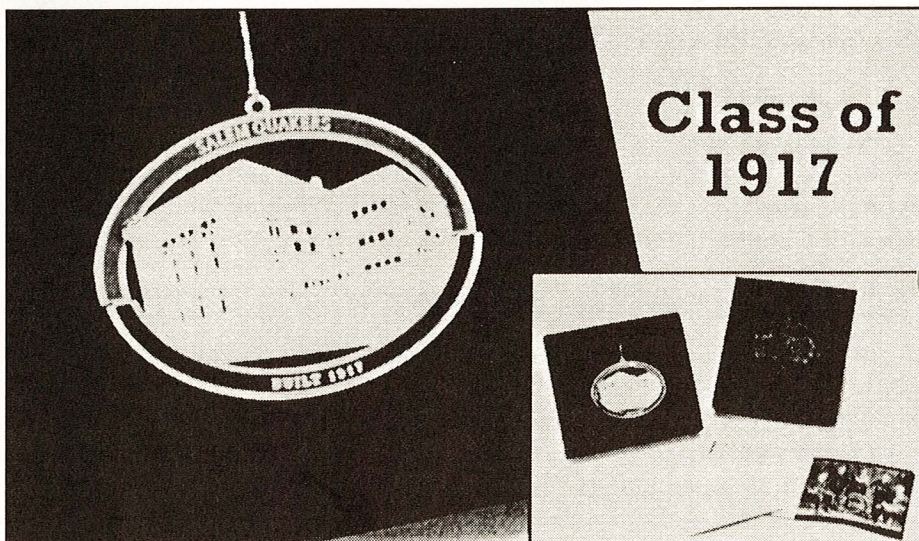

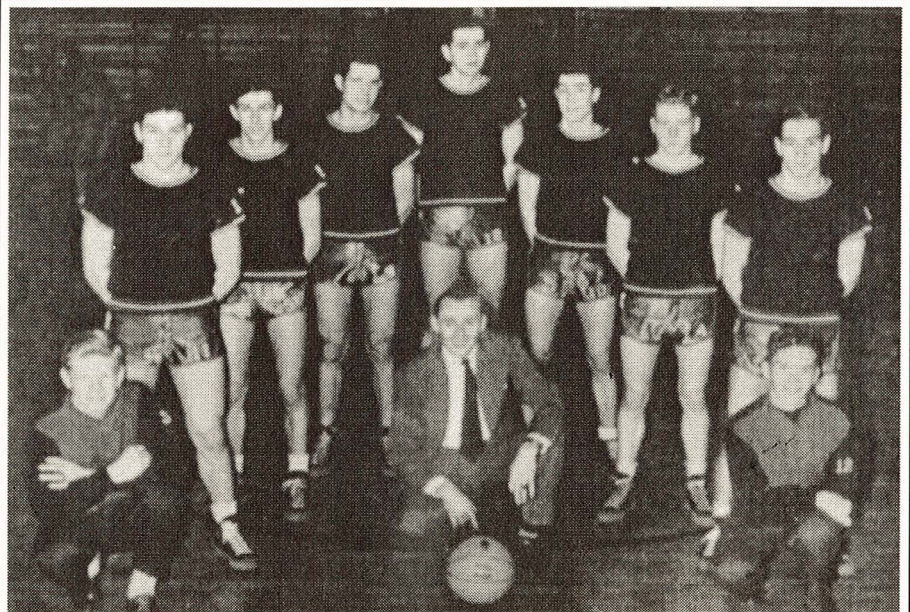
