Alumni give 45 students \$142,500 in scholarships

Forty-five students received a total of \$142,500 in scholarships during the 122nd annual reunion and banquet of the Salem High School Alumni Association on May 31st at Timberlanes.

Academic scholarships, which are given to graduates based on their class rank, were given to: Valedictorians Mariah Knepper and Laura Rohleder, \$6,500 each; Sara Zimmerman, Mandy Brayn, and Tiffanie Heestand, \$6,000 each; Jim Dombroski, Chris Frank, Chris Hritz, and Joel Getzinger, \$5,500 each; Elizabeth Hays, Sara DeCrow, and Matt Stelts, \$5,000 each; Ryan Barrett and Ronda Milliron, \$4,500 each; Kelli Crouse, \$4,000; Cassandra Nyktas, Shani Jones, Nick Fithian, and Matt Mowery \$3,500 each; Andrew Miller, Lisa Lewis, Ali Gano, Kristen Chappell, Abi Yanek, Ryan Riley, and Sarah Loudon, \$3,000 each.

Floyd and Cora May Reich Stone Vocational Scholarships were given to four students who plan to pursue associate degrees or other career training. The recipients of the \$1,000 Stone Vocational Scholarships were Alicia Barnes, Jennifer Hartman, Jamie Jewell, and Angela Ventresco.

Max Fisher Athletic Scholarships of \$1,000 each were given to Geoff Cody, Derek Frederick, Taylor Hendricks, Kari Kyser, Juli Maurer, Megan Sampson, Chris Sedgwick, and Darren Weingart.

J. Robert Sebo Achievement Scholarships were given to three students who were involved in an array of high school and community activities and whose grade point averages exceeded 2.5 Elizabeth Finnicum, Curt Howells, and Emily Loudon each received \$1,000 scholarships.

Two graduates - Ross Helmick and Meghan Honeywell - were each given \$1,000 J. Robert Sebo Bowling Green Scholarships to attend the state university in Bowling Green, Ohio.

Twins Katherine Myers and Thomas Myers were each given \$2,000 Sebo

College Scholarships. Both are 2000 graduates of Salem High School and are enrolled at Ohio University. The Sebo College Scholarships are given to Salem graduates who have demonstrated excellence in their college careers and have financial need.

Since the SHS Alumni Association began in 1908, it has awarded a total of \$3,008,263 in scholarships to 1,496 students. Previous outstanding scholarship winners include Charles Burchfield '11, famous American watercolorist, and Ella Thea Smith Cox '16, author of Exploring Biology, a widely-used high school textbook.

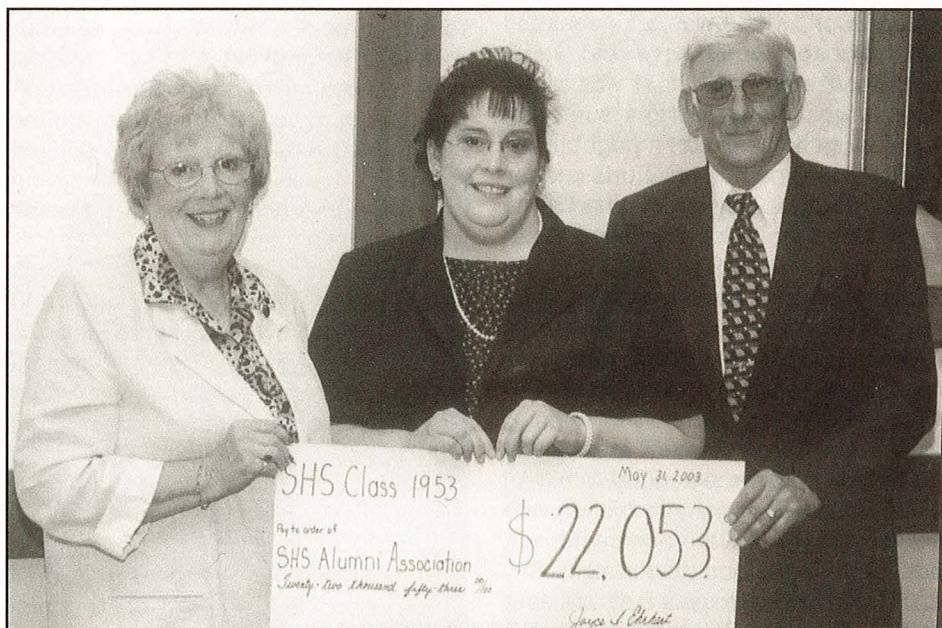
The alumni association's scholarships are funded solely from the interest of its

scholarship fund, which currently exceeds \$5 million in principal.

In addition to the academic scholarships, \$196,325 in Max Fisher awards have been given to 190 student athletes since 1973; \$67,400 in Stone Vocational Scholarships have been given to 66 students since 1987; \$35,000 in Sebo Achievement Awards to 13 students since 1999; \$8,000 in Sebo Bowling Green Scholarships since 2001; \$7,500 in Sebo College Scholarships to three students since 2002.

This year's Fox Scholarships to individuals pursuing advanced degrees in health-related fields will be made later this summer. From 1993 to 2002, 84 students shared \$126,500 in scholarship funds.

Outstanding alumnus praises Salem, its schools and library

Dr. Lori Roth '69, the Outstanding Alumnus for 2003, spoke to 418 people gathered for the 122nd Annual Reunion and Banquet of the Salem High School Alumni Association. She began her speech by addressing the senior award recipients about how she had felt when she was a new SHS graduate and her experiences since then working with college students.

Dr. Roth is assistant vice chancellor of Academic Affairs for the California State University system. She received her bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees from Kent State University. An author, Dr. Roth writes frequently on academic issues and other non-fiction topics.

In her address, she humorously compared the surveys of college freshmen by researchers from the University of Southern California at Los Angeles with the opinions she held as a freshman at Kent State University in 1969.

"In addition to asking myself the questions on the UCLA survey, I also thought about a question that has never yet been asked of new college freshmen. And that question goes like this: 'Are you grateful for and appreciative of this opportunity you've been given?'"

"Now, how would I have answered that question when I was a freshman? I think I probably would have said 'yes, I am,' because at that time, I was pretty appreciative of myself. I'm sure that when I was 18 years old I thought that it was my own superhuman efforts and my own extraordinary talents that had given me the opportunity for a college education.

"I know now, of course, that it wasn't me; that it wasn't my own smarts or skills; that there were, in fact, other very important factors that created opportunities for me.

"First and foremost, my family, and that includes all the extended family of aunts, uncles, cousins, and friends who always gave me love, encouragement, and support. Second, the Salem City Schools, which gave me a first rate education ... Third, the Salem Public Library, which allowed a poor kid with no money but with a passion for reading to have access to all the books she ever could have wanted.

"Fourth, the entire Salem community, which taught me to value and respect

hard work and helped me learn that if you're going to do something, you're going to do it well, and you're going to do it right.

"I know now that these four powerful forces in my life, not my own superhuman efforts and extraordinary talents, have allowed me to be successful in college and in my career. And they are the reason I'm standing at this podium tonight ... thanks to all of you for giving me this extraordinary once-in-a-lifetime experience tonight."

Dr. Roth was introduced by Frank Zamarelli '82, Alumni Association 2nd vice president. He also introduced the classes attending the banquet. Responses were given by Mildred Shuster '33 for the 70th year class; Ruth Hutson '38, for the 65th year class; Aggie Tullis '43, for the 60th year class; and Joyce Cosgrove Ehrhart '53 and Ed Votaw '53, for the 50th year class.

Dr. Roth wrote to the alumni board in July, thanking its members for the honor of the alumnus award and the extra attention paid to her parents at the banquet. She wrote that she was most impressed by number and size of the scholarships the association gives.

"I was stunned to learn that one quarter of the graduating class receives a substantial amount of financial support. This is an extraordinary investment in the students' future, and probably cannot be equaled in any other community."

Class efforts boost alumni fund

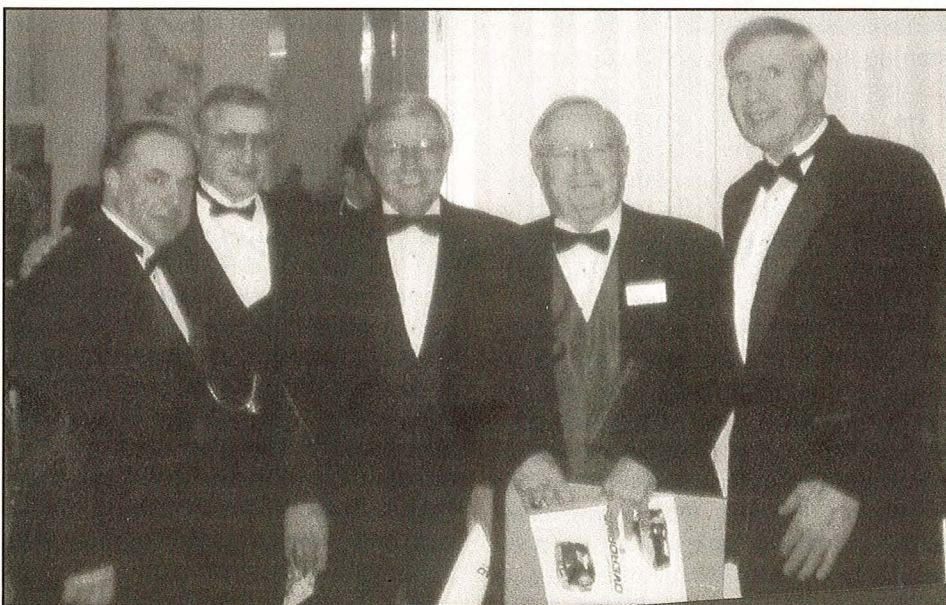

Father of "rock and roll" SHS alum

The strains of trombone music emanated from the Freed home on Seventh Street in the late 1930s as young Alan John Freed sorted through dozens of sheet music scores working on arrangements for his young band.

Irene Beals '38, of Columbus, remembers her childhood neighbor "Al J" fondly. He was such a shy kid, always had an instrument with him as if it was a part of his body," she wrote recently to the alumni office.

Alan's fellow students at Salem High were the musicians in his Sultans of Swing Band which was booked nearly every weekend for dances in the area. Music had always been an integral part of Alan's life, but neither he nor his parents, Charles and Maude, could envision where that love would take him. Nor could they imagine the fame their son would enjoy because of it.

After he graduated from Salem High School in 1940, Freed moved from jobs as a general broadcaster, sportscaster and disc jockey playing hot jazz and pop with radio stations in New Castle, Youngstown and Akron. He won a permanent spot at WJW in Cleveland.

His sponsor at the station, Cleveland's Rendezvous Records owner Leo Mintz, and his promoter, Lew Platt, both urged him to concentrate on black rhythm and blues music; black musicians were putting a different emphasis on the old R & B music. At first reluctant, Alan soon fell in love with the sound.

The program would begin with Todd Rhode's "Blues for Moon Dog" playing in the background, and Alan yipping, moaning and braying as he geared up for another evening of hosting what would become one of the hottest shows on radio.

"Hello, everybody," he'd say, "How y'all tonight?" slipping on a golf glove, he banged on a huge telephone directory in time to the music, perhaps "Money Honey" by the Drifters or "Shake Hands" by Faye Adams. Then a cowbell sounded and Alan would shout, "This is Alan Freed, King of the Moondoggers!"

His energetic commentary never let up as he introduced one platter after another in his tiny broadcasting studio. The kids loved "The Big Beat, The

Sound." Alan called the music Rock and Roll, primarily to deflect racial prejudice, but more importantly, because it was different, more vital and less sorrowful than the old rhythm and blues.

Without the money for a sophisticated promotion, Alan decided to host a special ball for him, their king, and his subjects, the adoring and rapturous teens. The Moondog Coronation Ball, held 51 years ago in March, was an entertainment phenomenon, the event that birthed Rock and Roll.

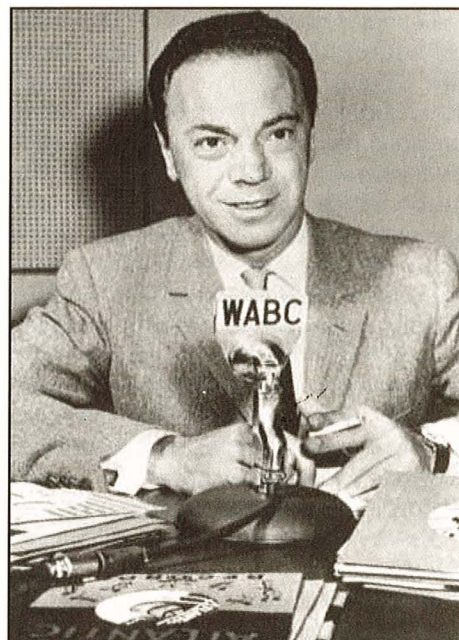
It made Alan Freed's name synonymous with the movement, and, 21 years after his early death at the age of 44, placed him among the original inductees into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in Cleveland.

By 1954, rhythm and blues had moved into the mainstream and teens everywhere, white and black, were dancing to "The Big Beat." The principal mover was Alan Freed, whose popularity spiraled as he crossed racial and cultural lines in pushing the music he loved, the sounds that eventually displaced the ballads of crooners like Frank Sinatra and the big band leftovers as the country's favorites.

Alan promoted black artists as rock and roll artists and his star continued to rise as he emceed stage shows in the east, had an ABC television show, and starred in several rock and roll movies filmed in Hollywood. He played himself in the movie, "Rock Around the Clock" starring the legendary Bill Haley and His Comets and The Platters.

He returned to Salem to make an appearance at the State Theater on June 3, 1956. Alan also attended ceremonies in Salem to take part in a time capsule burial in front of the public library. A copy of his song, "Sincerely" is contained in the capsule.

Payola had been more or less accepted since 1863 when the composer of "Tenting Tonight on the Old Camp Grounds" gave the leader of the Hutchison Singing Family a portion of his royalties. But when the idolized intellectual, Charles Van Doren reluctantly admitted he'd secretly been receiving answers to questions on a 1959 television quiz show, the public was horrified and the ensuing scandal was too encompassing for people like Alan Freed to escape. In another era,

perhaps, the results might not have been as damaging.

Alan was one of the casualties, and, although he claimed he'd received money for consultation and not as an inducement to play recordings, he was fired from his radio and television programs. He said his final goodbye on Nov. 23, 1959, telling his listeners, "this is not goodbye, it's just goodnight."

The disillusioned Alan, drinking heavily after a series of career disappointments, died of cirrhosis of the liver and bleeding esophageal varices on Jan. 20, 1965 in Palm Springs, Calif., the day Lyndon Johnson was inaugurated as president of the United States. His friends insisted he died of a broken heart.

But Alan's place in history was secured in 1986 when he was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in Cleveland. And then later, in 1991, he was awarded a star on Hollywood's Walk of Fame. Among the hundreds of performers he made famous during his brief career were Jerry Lee Lewis, Buddy Holly and the Crickets, Fats Domino, Chuck Berry, The Four Aces, Frankie Lymon, The Diamonds, Danny and The Juniors, The Chantals, Billy Ford and The Thunderbirds.

He is buried in the Ferncliff Memorial Mausoleum in Hartsdale, N.Y. The simply-worded plaque reads, "Freed- Alan 1921-1965."

Salem schools mark 150th anniversary

The Salem City School District will mark its 150th anniversary in 2003-2004.

According to Dr. Joseph A. Shivers, Director of Curriculum, Instruction, and Personnel, the district will celebrate its sesquicentennial with a number of activities throughout the school year. "We want as many alumni as possible to return to Salem for the different events," Shivers said.

During the 2003 football season former football players, managers, trainers, coaches, cheerleaders, homecoming court members and their escorts, and band members will be recognized at games. On August 29, 2003, all alumni who participated in the

1920's, '30's, '40's, and '50's are invited to attend the football game against East Palestine. Participants from the 1960's and '70's will be honored at the Poland game on October 3; 1980's alumni who were part of the listed groups are invited to the Canfield game on October 10; and all who participated in any of the seasons from 1990-2002 are encouraged to attend the Niles football game on October 17, 2003. Other tentative plans include

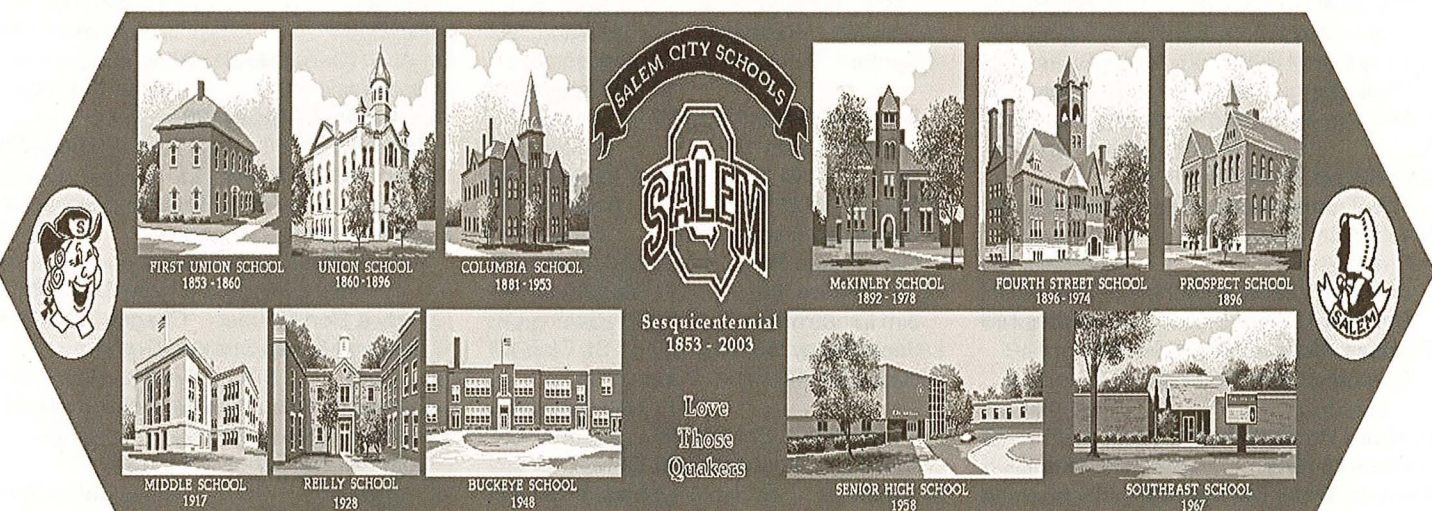
- inviting former teachers and staff, alumni basketball players, and members of all extracurricular organizations -

Music collection of Doc's bands on CD

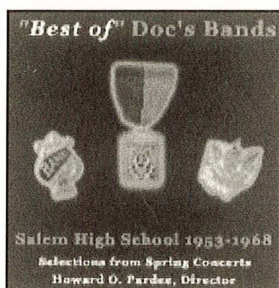
Music by Salem's high school and community musicians under the direction of Howard "Doc" Pardee has been put together in a specially compiled CD available to alumni and benefiting the Salem High School Alumni Association's Pardee Band Scholarship Fund.

Information about the Pardee fund and the Best of Doc's Bands CD is being displayed at Salem High class reunions and alumni events throughout the year, according to Lorraine Pardee Bell, Howard Pardee's daughter. The CD contains selections from various spring high school band concerts from 1953 to 1968 and touches a wide number of alums, who either were band personnel or part of their audience at school functions.

Also, Jerry Wolford has compiled two videos that commemorate two other themes: One documents the building of

the band shell in Waterworth Park and Quaker City Band events held there. Both the shell and the band were projects carried on through the efforts of Doc Pardee and others.

Another video is a personal retrospective comprised of photos of Doc, narrated by Richard Theiss with back-



ground music played by the 1956 SHS band in its spring concert.

The Pardee Band Scholarship Fund's goal is

to raise \$100,000 to provide money for college scholarships, summer music camp tuition or private lessons for Salem middle school and high school students. Doc taught beginning stu-

dents in fifth grade and continued to be their teacher in junior and senior high. In addition, he was supervisor of music for the entire school music program, including vocal and instrumental music. Doc retired in 1975 after 39 years of teaching in Ohio public schools.

Julia Vance '81 becomes nurse, midwife

Julia Vance's ambition to become a nurse and midwife had its beginnings when she was 10 years old and helping her father deliver a baby in the bedroom of a rural Salem home.

The birth was one of 2,000 home births Dr. Ralph "Doc" Vance performed during his years as a physician in Salem. Now 39 and immersed in her plans for her home delivery practice in the Portland, Oregon area, Julia still remembers that day when, as her father's helper, she placed an ether-soaked cloth over the mother's face.

She talked about her life recently with a reporter from the *Portland Oregonian*, a story which her father sent to us. Her mother, Ruth died of lung cancer when Julia was 6, and her father, now 91, raised her and his other youngsters in the family home on 16th Street in Salem.

If some of Dr. Vance's patients couldn't pay, he accepted live chickens, canned

peaches or fresh milk. Patients often paid him back by painting the house or fixing the furnace in his home or office on Third Street.

Her father valued medicine over money, and Julia has adapted that premise in her own life. A registered nurse and aspiring midwife, she will soon earn her master's degree in nursing from the Oregon Health and Science University. That degree will enable her to open the practice with two other midwives to serve women who are pregnant and want good care for their babies but who may not have health insurance.

"I'm not a religious person in the typical sense," she says in the article. "But birth is as close to a miraculous event as we humans get to see."

Julia became a feminist and moved to Colorado where she lived in a tepee, subsisting on cleaning a restaurant and chopping wood. She became the family

breadwinner when she set up a household with the father of her two children. The two youngsters are Michael, 16, and Katy, 14. After the family moved to Oregon, she entered nursing school at OHSU.

Her first nursing job was serving pregnant women and new mothers. Home visits took her to trailers, migrant camps and even cars. Her second job was teaching baby care to first-time parents, many of whom were poor.

Then she joined a county and state workers team helping addicted mothers get clean. These were women who had lost custody of their children, or were about to, because they couldn't care for them. Some forged checks, some stole food, some sold drugs and some sold themselves, Julia told the *Oregonian*.

After a lifelong battle with obesity, she won by losing 180 pounds with diet and exercise alone. She rode in a 100-mile bicycle race in 2001. She was thin and vibrant. She loved the SHS band, and played trumpet."

The column written by Kriss K. Jenny-Case in the Sunbury News on Oct. 31, 2002 was dedicated to Mary Rose, co-owner of the Sunbury Country Store and Cafe. Portions of the

column follow:

"There was something about Mary that reminded you of a sunshine-filled day when you were a kid and couldn't wait for the next big adventure or the next opportunity to laugh or share a secret with a friend...There was something about Mary that made you want to cheer her on. She was always a straight shooter and told it like it was...There was something about Mary that made you feel like family. It could have been months since the last time you saw her, but she would remember your previous conversations and ask about how things were going in your

life . . . There was something about Mary that made me stop by the store one recent cloudy late afternoon, just to look around. Even though I hadn't been by in months, when Mary saw me she stopped what she was doing and we talked as old friends do . . . We talked so long that it was time to close the store for the day . . . There was something about Mary that made me give her a hug as I was leaving and say to her, Ya done good, sister! There are a lot of little somethings about Mary that I will miss greatly, but I will be forever grateful that I had the opportunity to tell her how proud I was of her."
