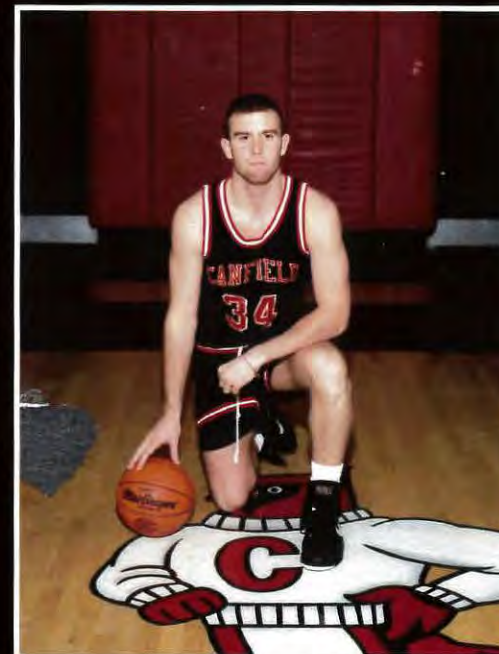


Featured Teacher: *William Klucinec*

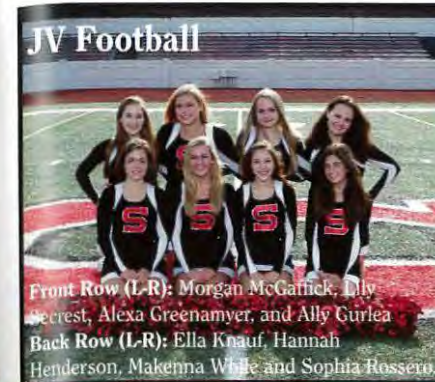
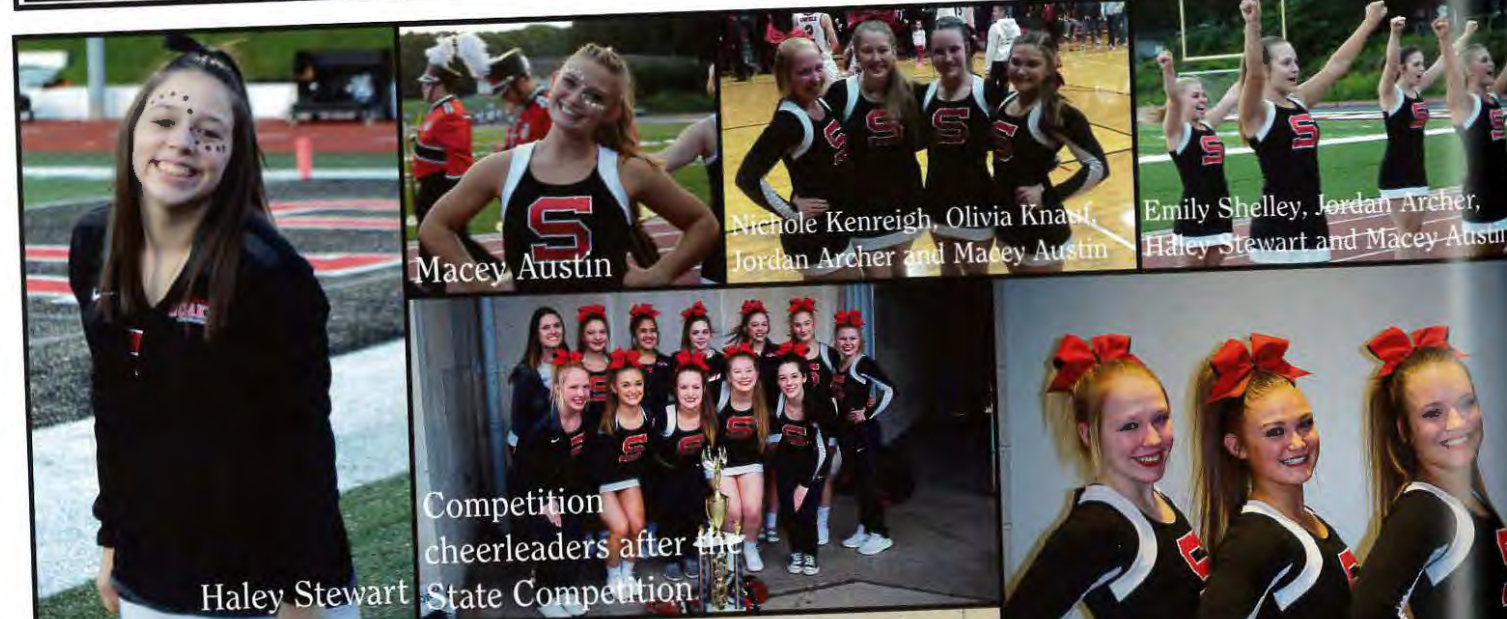

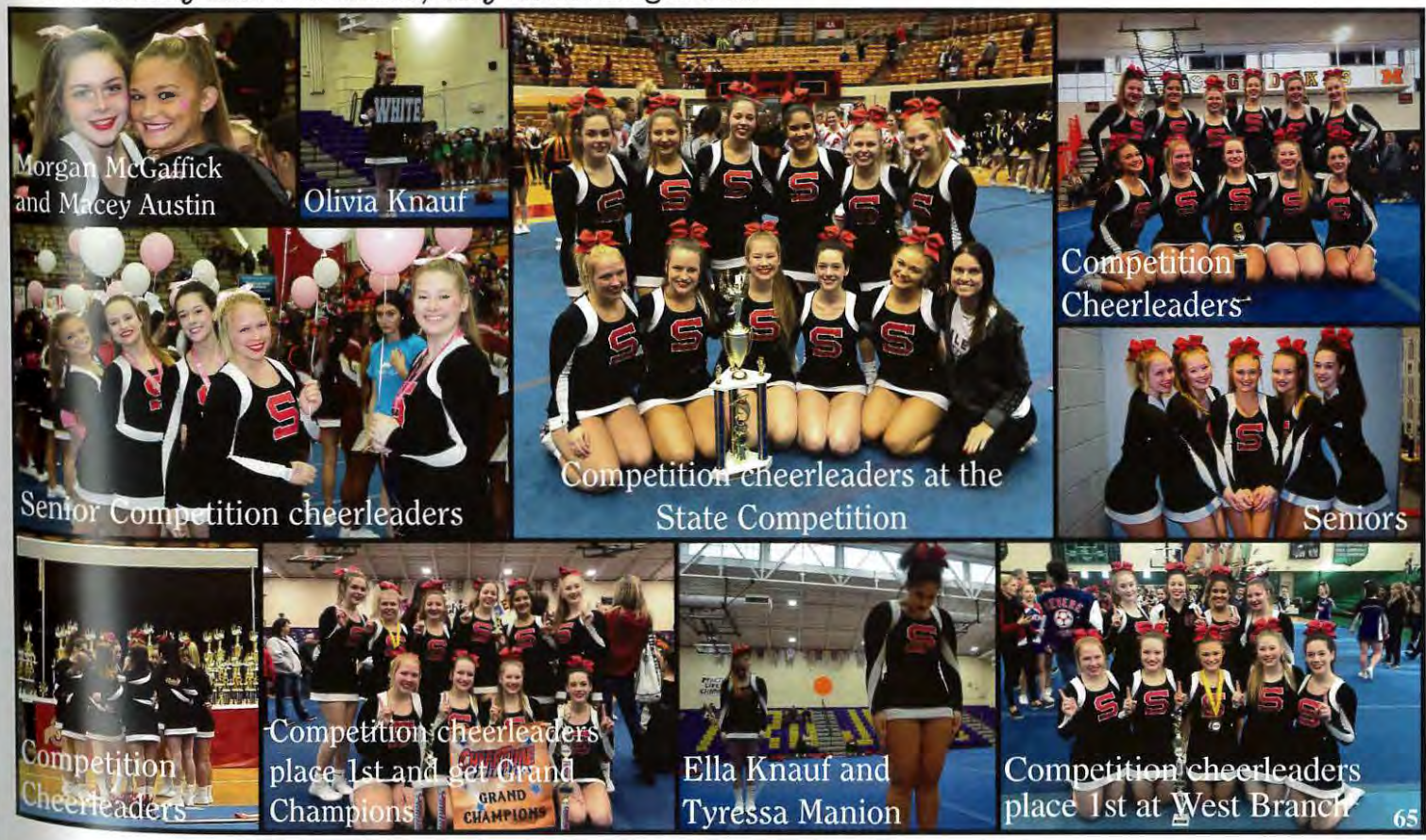


Cheerleading "Bring It On"

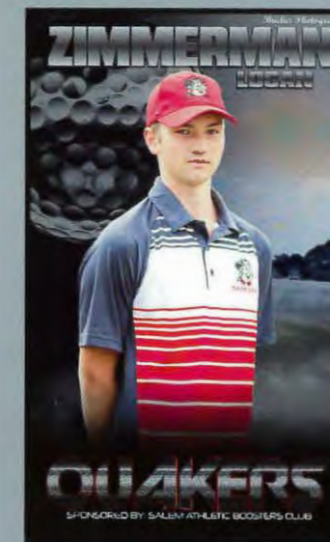

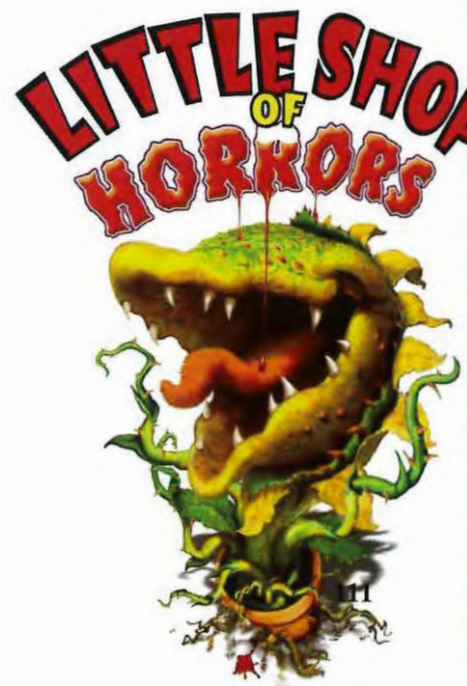
Little Shop of Horrors

The cast and crew created a wonderful musical along with three amazing Audrey Twos!





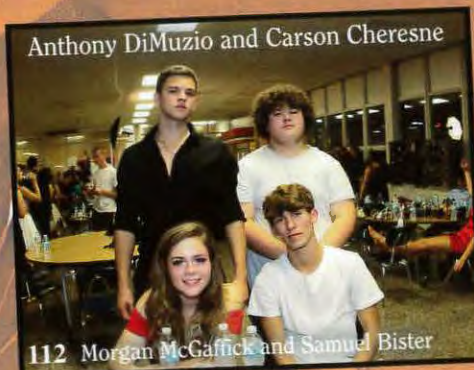
