unfold.

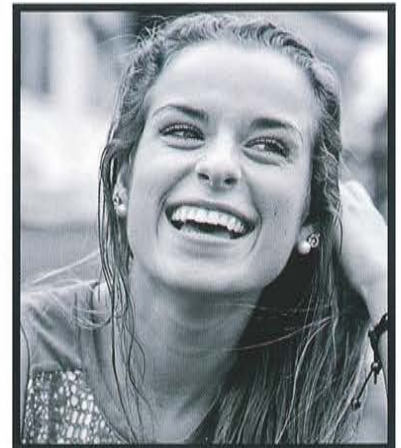
We sit with our eyes closed, ignoring our class,

is turned.

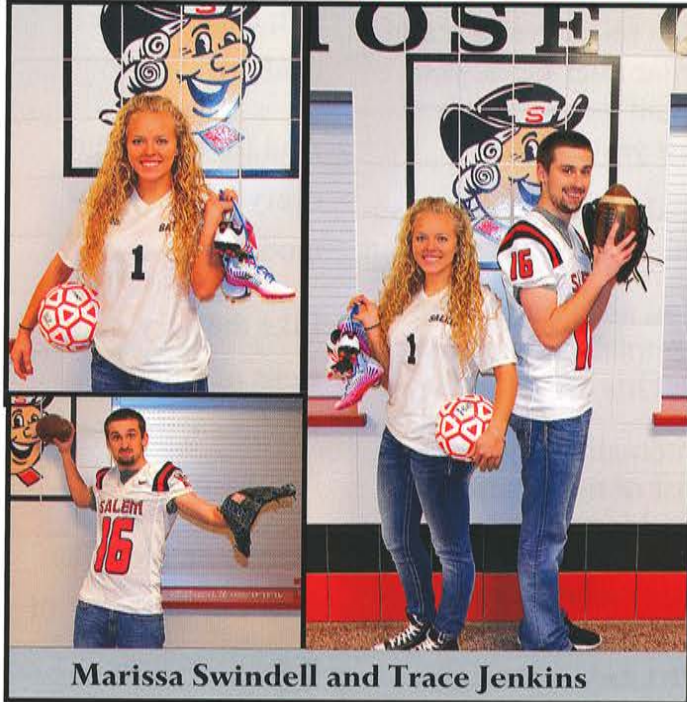

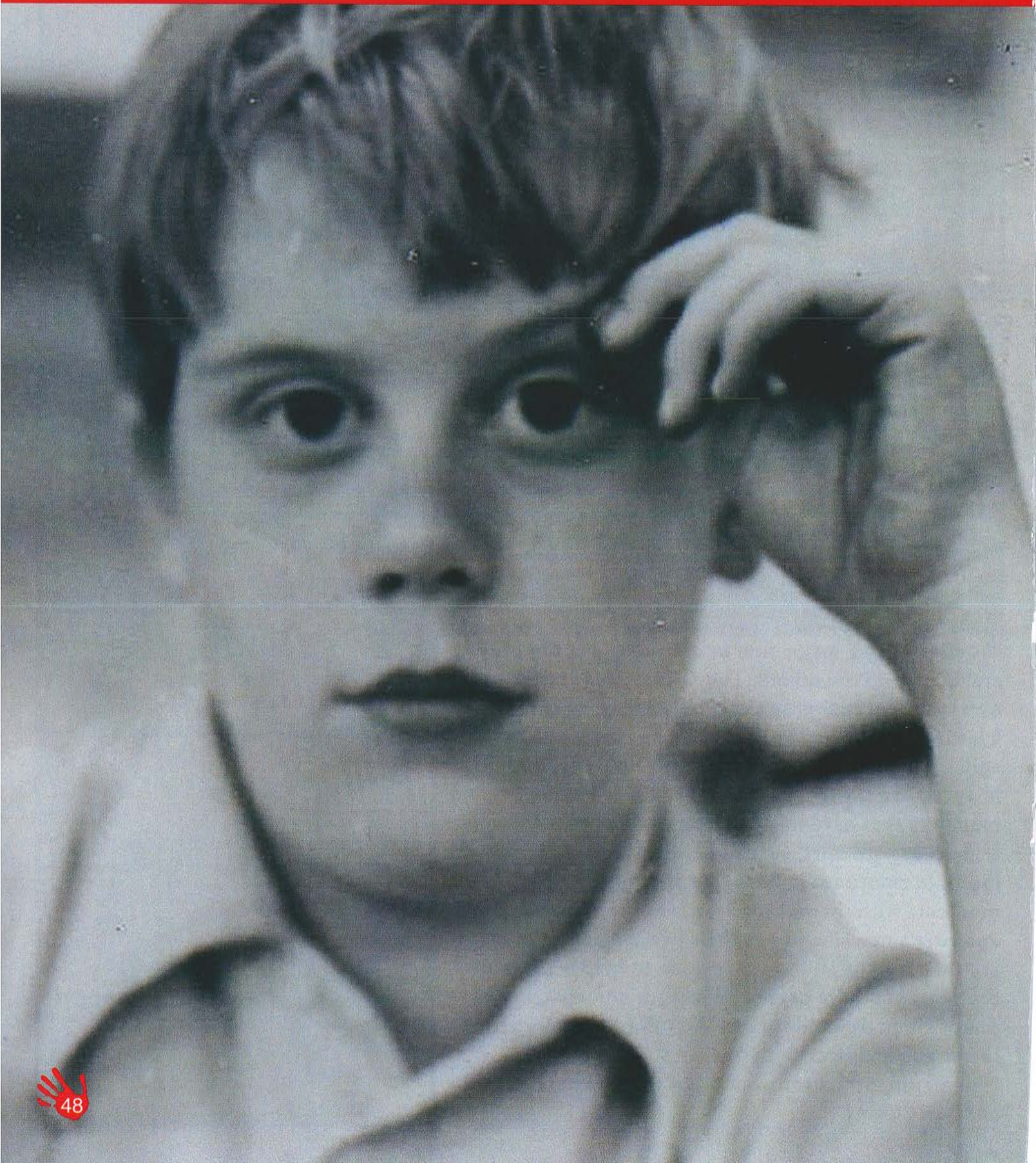
A Farewell to the Retiring Teachers

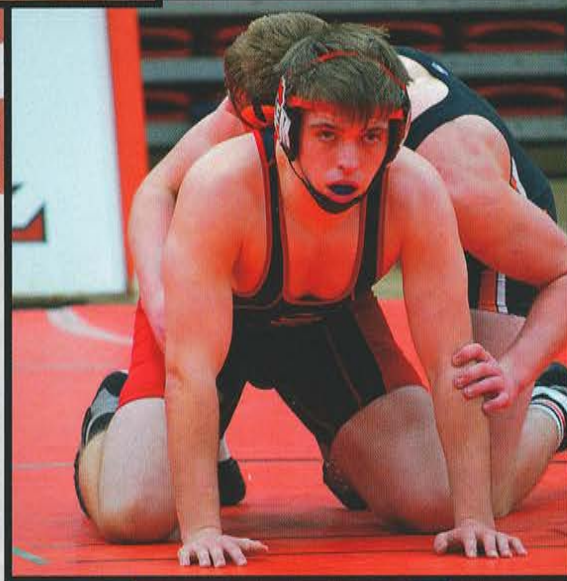

Toss Me a Pair Class of 2016 Shoe Drive

The junior class held a shoe drive to fund the Fire and Ice Prom of 2015. Their goal was to collect 15,000 pairs of shoes. With the help of students and people from the surrounding communities of Salem, Alliance and Boardman, 16,400 pairs of shoes were collected for Funds2Orgs. This organization takes the shoes to third world countries and teaches the people how to clean the shoes and sell them in their markets to raise money for food, animals or their families.
