


future, and his job is to help contribute to his or her academic success in the future as much as possible. He believes in his students and their abilities and assists them in pursuing their future plans as much as he can.



Green. At the banquet Bo Whinnery became an honorary coach; he retired after 13 years of announcing.






















Road Block Ahead

Northwest in the consolation final. In Columbus, with his hard work and dedication, he made it to the podium with 5th place overall.













