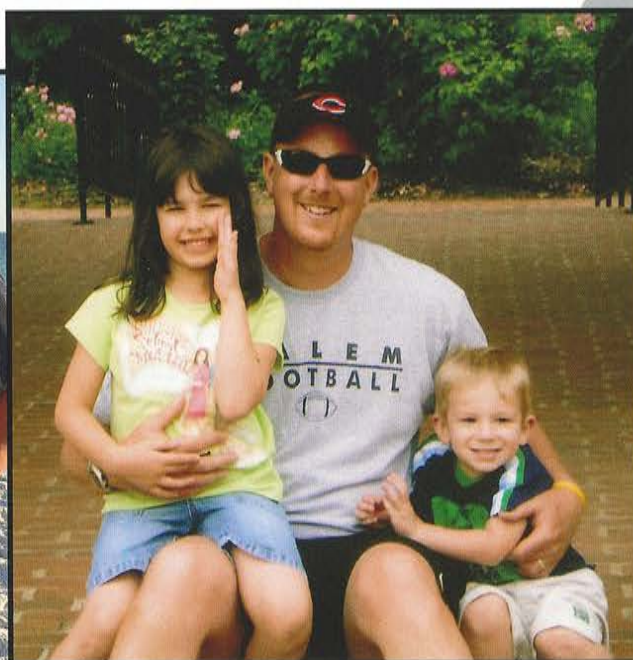
Featured Teacher

For it's fourth consecutive year, Columbiana County had a Honor's Band and Choir. It is hosted by a different school each year. This past spring it was at Beaver Local High School.

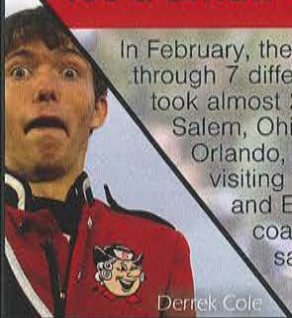
Concert Season

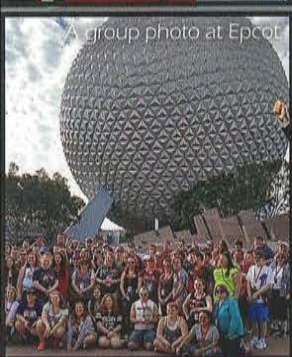
It's a Small World After All!

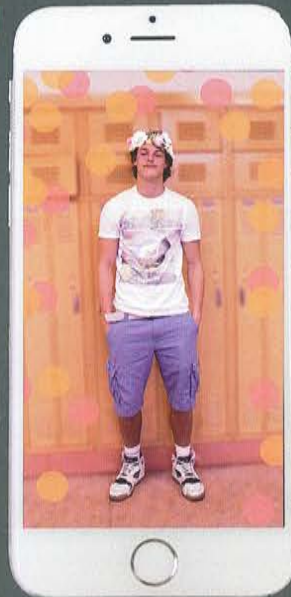

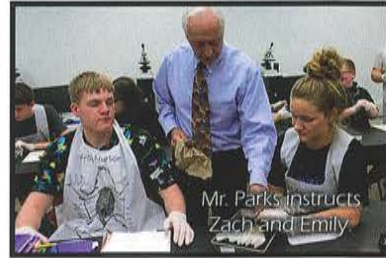
